Matching a career-low round has given Paul Casey a big lead with one round to play in the 2018 Travelers Championship.

Casey shot a bogey-free, 8-under-par 62 on Saturday to build a four-shot lead through 54 holes at TPC River Highlands. It ties the tournament record for largest lead after three rounds; Sam Snead (1955), Bob Murphy (1970) and Tim Norris (1982) also had four-shot leads with one round to play. All three players went on to win the tournament.

At 16-under-par, Casey leads Russell Henley, who shot a 67 and is at 12-under. J.B. Holmes (65), Anirban Lahiri (65) and second-round leader Brian Harman (69) were tied for third at 11-under.

It's the second time in Casey's PGA TOUR career that he has shot 62; he opened the 2015 Sony Open with the same number, on his way to a T30 finish. In three previous appearances in the Travelers Championship, Casey has enjoyed success. He lost a playoff to Bubba Watson in 2015, tied for 17th in 2016 and was T5 in 2017.

Earlier on Saturday, The First Tee of Connecticut's annual breakfast awarded 38 students nearly \$40,000 in scholarship money. In the evening, country singer Tyler Farr capped the Liberty Bank Concert Series with a performance in the Stanley Black & Decker Fan Zone. Also, many of the approximately 4,000 volunteers celebrated tournament week at the Volunteer Party in the Pro-Am tent.
